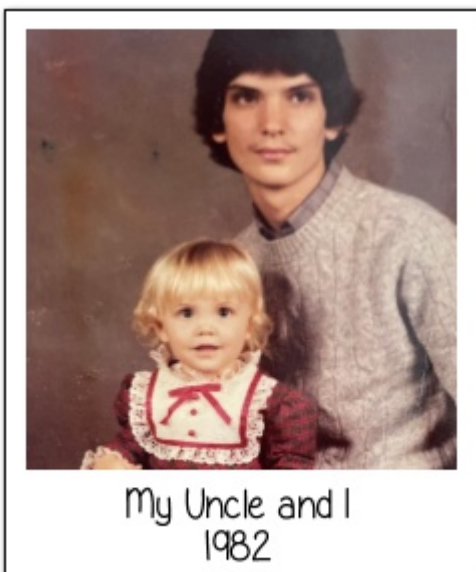
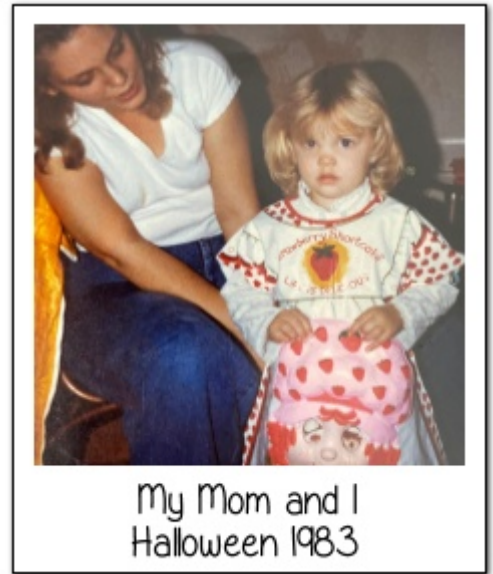


About
